ORDINANCE 2025- 01

AMENDING SECTION 236-11 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING STREET USE PERMITS

WHEREAS, section 236-11 of the Code of Ordinances currently prohibits the issuance of a street use permit in excess of six hours; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds it appropriate to permit the issuance of such permits for longer periods of time under certain circumstances.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Black Earth, Dane County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 236-11.E of the Code of Ordinances is amended to read as shown in Exhibit A attached hereto.

SECTION 2. All other provisions of the Code of Ordinances not specifically amended herein shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided for by law.

The above foregoing ordinance was duly adopted at a meeting of the Village Board on Wednesday July 2, 2025.

EXHIBIT A

§ 236-11 Street use permits.

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E. Mandatory denial of street use permit.

(1) An application for a street use permit shall be denied if:

- (a) The proposed street use is primarily for private or commercial gain.
- (b) The proposed street use would violate any federal or state law or any ordinance of the Village.
- (c) The proposed street use will substantially hinder the movement of police, fire or emergency vehicles, constituting a risk to persons or property.
- (d) The application for a street use permit does not contain the information required above.
- ~~(e) The application requests a period for the use of the street in excess of six hours.~~
- (f) The proposed use could equally be held in a public park or other location.

(2) In addition to the requirement that the application for a street use permit shall be denied, as hereinabove set forth, the Village Board may deny a permit for any other reason or reasons if it concludes that the health, safety and general welfare of the public cannot adequately be protected and maintained if the permit is granted.

(3) No street use permit shall be granted for a period in excess of six hours unless; either (1) all property owners and legal tenants of property fronting on the portion of the street to be closed agree to such closure in writing, or (2) all properties fronting on the portion of the street are provided reasonable access to enter and exit the property by motor vehicle throughout the period of closure.

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
